Types of Computer

The device needs to be a laptop computer with a **full operating system**. The device needs network access to allow connection to a secured Wi-Fi network (802.11g or newer). The devices listed below meet the minimum requirements to function on our network and work with our established systems. Chromebooks are not compatible with our network and established systems at this time.

Additionally, it is recommended that each student have a USB-C adaptor similar to the one [here](#) if their chosen device only has USB-C ports available.

**Purchases can be made through the [Apple Education Online Shop](https://www.apple.com/us-hed/shop) (<https://www.apple.com/us-hed/shop>) to save around 10% on the device and it is recommended, but not required, that the Apple Extended Warranty (AppleCare) be purchased for Apple Computers. The warranty extends coverage from 1 year to 3 years.*
